Fantastic results by our girls at the UP-state board exams—93 girls passed from 10th Class and 52 girls passed from 12th Class.















### Back to school again!

We are pleased to announce that after a long period of closure, normal classes have resumed as we welcome back students from 1st to 12th standard.

Further, In order to protect our students and members of staff, we regularly sanitise the classrooms, buses and administer random temperature checks whilst they are on school premises.

We are also adhering to the social distancing and COVID-19 protocols where possible and ensure that our students are wearing masks at all times.







#### **Education: - A continuous process**

Despite the adverse circumstances of the pandemic, PPES ensured that there was as little disruption to the process of providing education to our girls. We accomplished this via various undertakings from the school's end which included zoom classes, WhatsApp online classes, worksheet distribution to girls, books and stationery distribution and providing tablets to students of class 10th and 12th.

We held an interactive training session for class 12th students provided by CSRBOX, a leading CSR knowledge and impact intelligence-driven media platform for the development community.

As a team we reacted and developed out of the box solutions to reach out to the community. We set up mobile classrooms to deliver lessons to our girls' doorstep. Initiated a safety attendance outreach program in order to ensure that each and every member of our society be it women of the SHGs or our students were healthy and safe. This Initiative ensured that we maintained contact with those who were most vulnerable none more so that young girls at risk of child marriage, we intervened in over 6 cases and are proud to report that they are safe and still in education.

#### Health and Hygiene – Our commitment to well being

Good hygiene enhances sound wellbeing. Keeping this in focus the following provisions were executed:

- Sanitary pads to the girls were distributed
- Facemask an important lifesaving was distributed to the girls and staff
- Session conducted by Genpact on menstrual hygiene and reproductive systems
- Distribution of School Uniforms to the girls
- Mobile health van resumed regular operations
- Conducted an awareness session on 'the benefits of menstrual cups' for class 11th students by a leading gynaecologist- Dr. Anuradha
- Vaccination campaign in three villages & vaccinated 260 people
- Health Education Classes- 7 classes for PPES girls

'Solar Charkha Unit': Bright Opportunity

Under the MSME ministry, there is a solar charkha mission by the central government. In which it's a plan to set up solar charkhas. Each charkha will have 25 units. The guidance and financial support will be given by Khadi gram Udyog, once the products are ready, Khadi Gram Udyog will take and give the daily wages to women working in the charkhas. Under this plan one charkha unity at Fatehpur village in Anupshahar has already been established. This presents a golden opportunity for our SHG women in terms of employment and economic upliftment.

#### **EDUCATION EMPOWERS CHANGE: KIRTI CHAUDHARY**

"PPES girls are strong-willed, determined, and courageous. Thanks to my school, I could see the worth of my dreams and fight to turn them into reality," says Kirti Chaudary, who comes from a family of four sisters and one brother. Her father owned a small stone mill and so there was always a dearth of financial resources in the family. Being the eldest sister it seemed that Kirti would never pursue formal education and would spend her life trying to look after the family. However, given her inclination towards studying her father was forced to enroll her at the PP school, and to everyone's surprise, she performed meritoriously in her 12th exams.

After school, her father asked her to drop the plan for further studies and get married. But, with the help of her teachers, she convinced him otherwise. She went on to do software engineering from NTTF and is presently working with a software company in Mumbai.
